

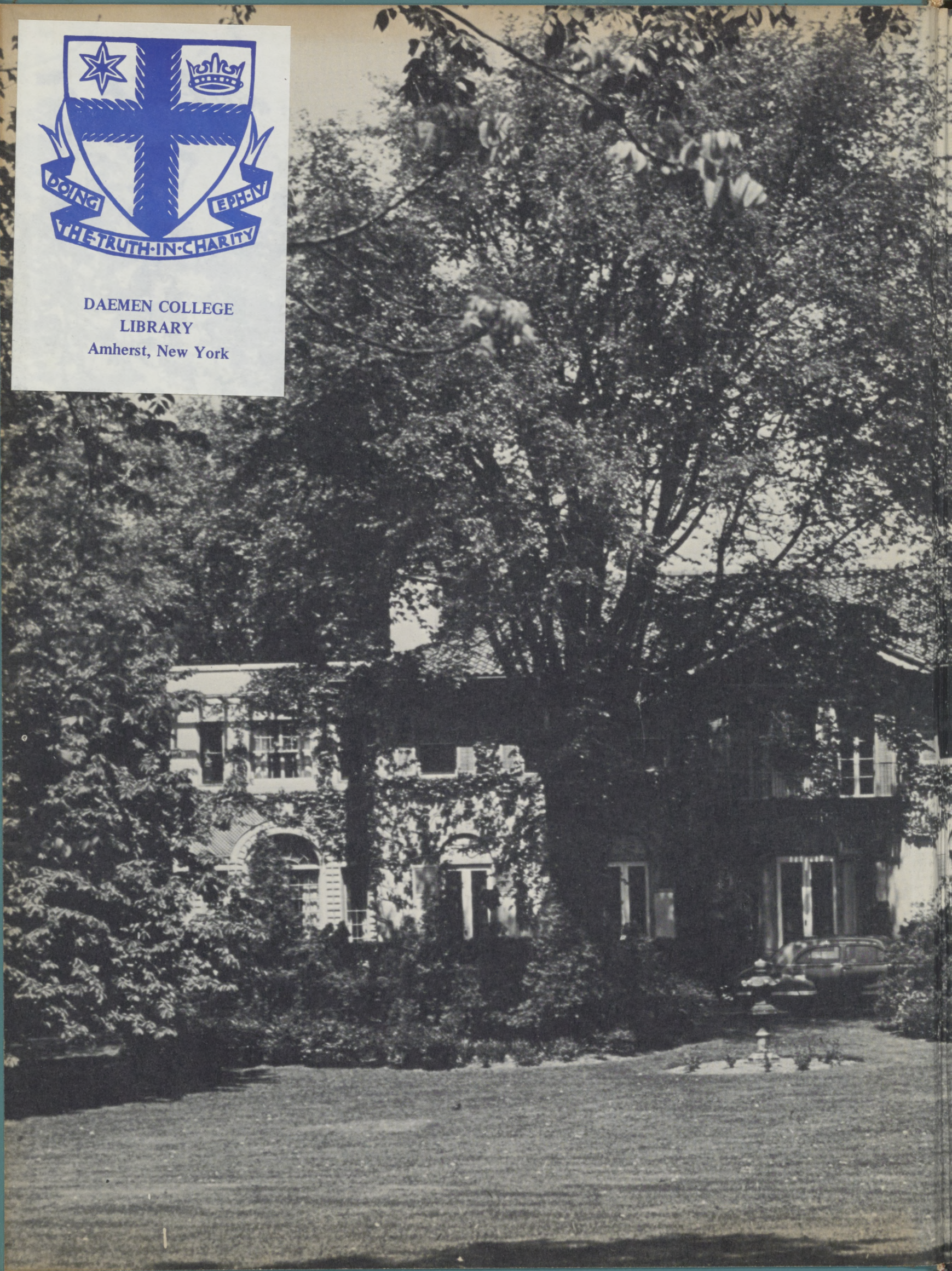

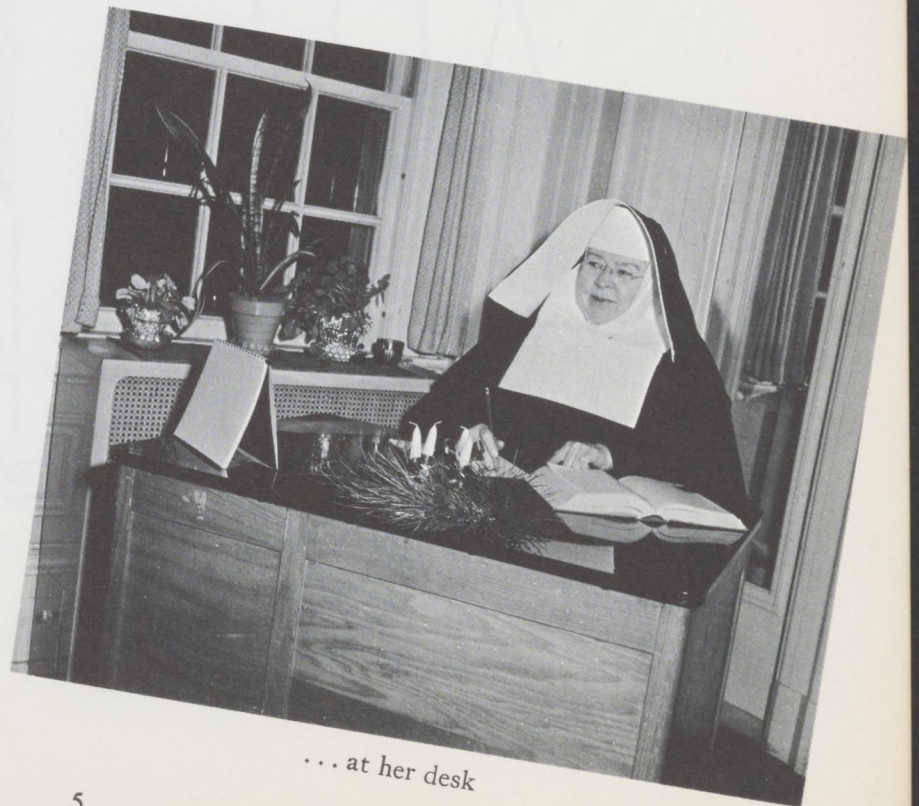
The passing years will never efface

Kappa Sigma Rho is an active Science society which provides varied program and activities for the members of the Science Department, and those students interested in scientific and industrial programs.



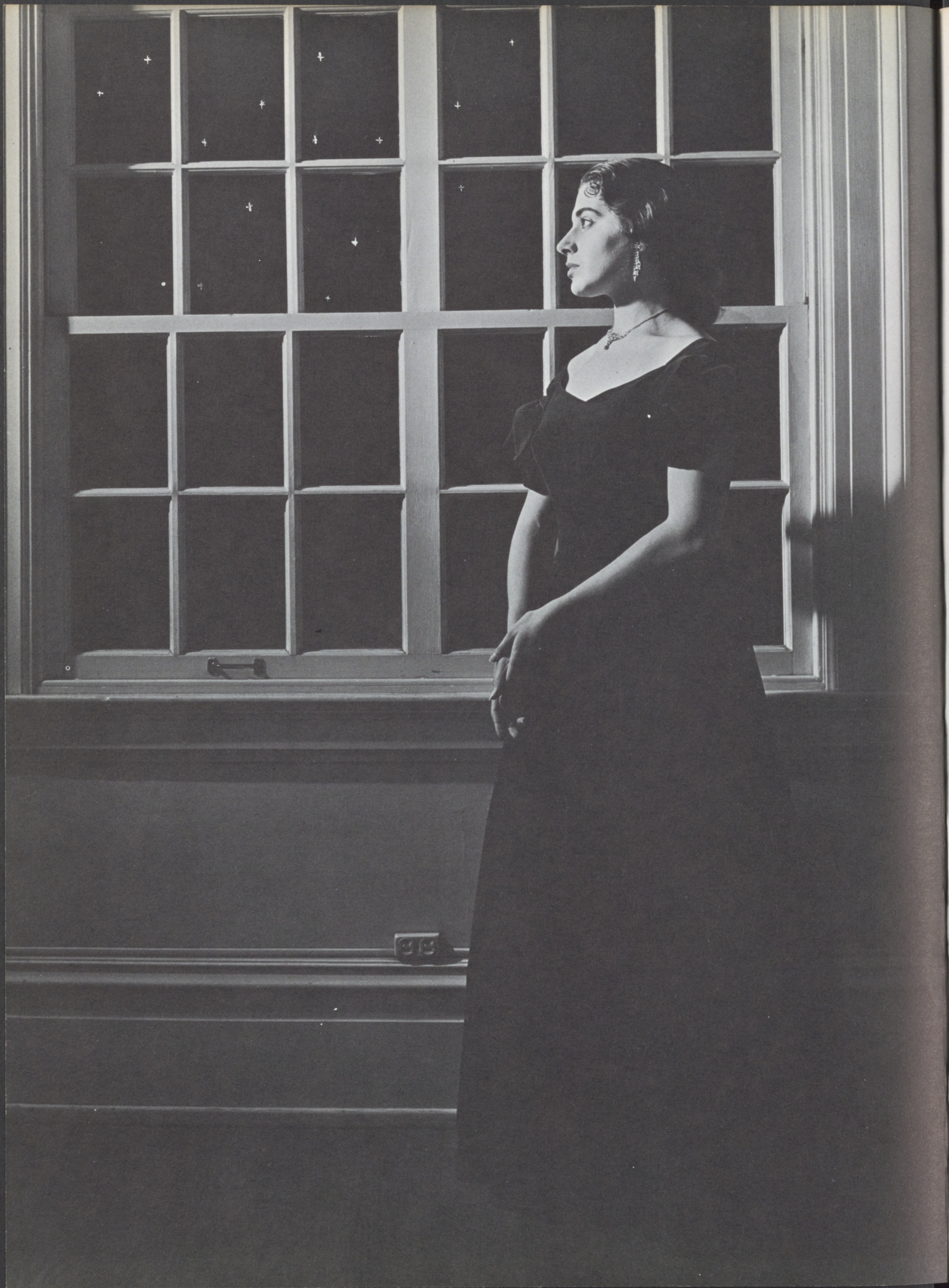
FORENSICS
