DID YOU KNOW... Daemen Now Has A Masters Program?

A post-licensure graduate program in Physical Therapy has been approved by State Board of Regents for Daemen. Our area has no comparable program; it will focus upon practitioners who choose to take advanced courses and specialize in either orthopedics or general practice. The twoyear program will commence in the Fall of 1993 with a class of twenty and be housed in our newly constructed Schenck Science building.

• Daemen College offers thirty-eight degree programs which are divided into four academic divisions: Business & Commerce, Fine & Performing Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences, and Natural & Health Sciences.

• This year's total enrollment is 1,707.

• Daemen College graduated its first class in 1952. Since then it has graduated 7,213 students 86% female and 14% male. Physical Therapy degrees have been awarded to 776 students.

Education Program, a Higher Education Opportunity Program and a Liberty Partnership Program.

The 37 acre campus has 12 buildings and, in addition, 21 residence halls. The newest is a science building, Schenck Hall, which was financed in large part through a bequest from the estates of Irene & Edward J. Schenck.
The Academic Resource Center is equipped with over 50 IBM, MacIntosh and Apple computers for student use.

• The Marian Library has over 130,000 volumes as well as a recreational reading collection. Other materials include more than 850 periodical subscriptions, audiovisual sets, videotapes, phonograph records and microfilm volumes. Each year about 3,000 volumes are added to support academic research requirements.

The Little Theatre has both new siding and windows. The seats have been replaced and the lobby has been spruced up with fresh paint, new carpeting and new drapes as well as a new bench and ticket counter.

The ongoing restoration of the **residence halls** includes new carpeting in Canavan Hall and replacement windows. Also, a laundry facility is being created on the first floor of each Campus Drive building.

The old phone operator station in the gym atrium has been converted into an *Admission Office reception room*.

Alex Nwora, Daemen College's all-time leading rebounder was named to NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletes), District 18, 1st Team, All District Team. Alex led the Warriors in scoring and rebounding, averaging 19.8 points per game and 11.6 rebounds per game. He is the Nation's 5th leading rebounder. He will be inducted into the College's Wall of Fame and is the 1st Warrior in history to score over 1500 points and grab over 1000 rebounds in his career. Alex will most likely continue his basketball career in Europe after graduating from Daemen's Graphic Design Program.

Teammate Mario Torres was named 2nd Team, All District. Mario is a junior Business major who averaged 12.9 points per game as well as 9 rebounds per game.

Darleen Pickering Hummert, class of 1967, is the recipient of the 1992 Distinguished Alumni Award. Darleen is currently an Associate at the Arts Council in Buffalo and Erie County where she is administrator for the Regrant Program and works on advocacy for the arts as well as public relations for the Arts Council. Darleen received her bachelors degree in psychology, with a minor in theatre, from Daemen (RHC) as well as a masters degree in theatre arts from Illinois State University. A Buffalo native and former Assistant to Chairman/Senior Staff Assistant in the Department of Theatre and Dance at the University at Buffalo, Darleen is a respected educator and arts administrator as well as a gifted and professional actor, playwright and director.

Darleen is founder and artistic director of Theatre for Change Company, dedicated to performing plays, improvisations and workshops dealing with critical issues such as family violence. Her involvement as Director of Haven House, a shelter for battered women and children in Buffalo, is a natural fit wherein she was commissioned to create a play involving domestic violence. The result was "Father Knows Best," a fortyfive minute domestic awareness drama written and directed by Darleen, a performance available to any group or organization.

In 1991, Darleen was presented with the Professional Staff Senate Award by the University at Buffalo in recognition of her exceptional educational and civic contributions to the university and the Western New York community.

In light of her many contributions to the community, her talent and professional successes, it is a great pleasure to congratulate Darleen Pickering Hummert as the Daemen College distinguished alumna for 1992.





Conferences on Campus

Learning doesn't end when you receive your diploma and shake the president's hand. "Education" continues throughout life, through worksite training, professional conferences, mentoring, volunteer training and continuing education. In support of this broader concept of education, Daemen College for many years, has been offering its campus to the community.

With its excellent facilities, relaxed atmosphere, personable staff, and reasonable costs, Daemen College is a perfect setting to enhance the "educational" nature of programs. Year-round, the campus has been used by many outside organizations as the site of educational forums, training sessions and conferences.

Daemen College has developed a solid reputation as an excellent spot for meetings and small conferences (up to 450 people). Since the establishment of a Conference Office in 1982, under the direction of the Business Office, community groups have been encouraged to meet at Daemen. Contacts with social, educational, business and religious organizations have brought meetings to campus and provided new sources of revenue for the college.

Residential conferences are scheduled primarily in the summer months, from mid-May to mid-August, when on-campus housing

is available. Lodging is provided in Canavan Hall or in Campus Drive apartments. Meal service and meetings are in Wick Center.

As one of the most unique programs each summer, Elderhostel has been offered at Daemen College since 1984. Elderhostel is a week-long, residential, academically-oriented program for anyone over 60. This year, in its tenth summer at Daemen, Elderhostel is scheduled during the weeks of June 6-12, July 4-10, and August 1-7, 1993. Each Elderhostel will attract about 45 seniors from all across the U.S., with courses taught by some of the finest faculty members at Daemen. Since its very modest beginnings, Elderhostel is now offered at over 1,800 locations nationally and internationally and is coordinated through the national office in Boston.

Outside the WNY region, there continues to be a strong interest nationwide in using college and university campuses to host conferences. Daemen College is listed in national publications such as the **Guide to Conferencing on Campus**. Through the **Guide**, Daemen regularly receives referrals regarding potential conferences.

It's easy to plan a conference at Daemen, because the first and main contact is with the Conference Office in Wick Center. Through the assistance of Conference Office staff, all arrangements for off-campus groups are coordinated. Arrangements may include: food services (including cafeteria line meals, coffee breaks, banquets, picnics, "snack breaks," meeting room arrangements, audiovisual needs, registration set-ups, lodging on campus (summer only), extra security services, parking, billing, maps and promotional information about the Daemen campus, and information on WNY area attractions.

Graduate Survey Cooperative Education & Career Development

Daemen College graduated 245 students in May of 1992. Six months later, a survey assessed the current status of the graduates with respect to employment, relationship between jobs and academic major, how jobs were found, salaries and advanced study. Presented here are the survey results, obtained from 222 (91%) of the new graduates. The remaining alumni were unable to be contacted by mail or phone.

After six months, 80% had found full-time employment. Another 13% were working part time. Most of the graduates (88%) feel that their work is directly or somewhat related to their academic major.

The average yearly income of all respondents with full-time jobs is \$23,685. By Division, graduates who found full-time employment earn an average yearly income of: Division of Arts - \$17,750, Division of Business and Commerce - \$17,500, Division of Humanities and Social Sciences - \$16,978, and Division of Natural Science - \$25,984.

Compared to the class of 1991, there was an increase in the number of graduates pursuing advanced study (6% in 1991, 10% in 1992). The percentage of graduates who have found full-time employment also increased slightly, from 78% in 1991 to 80% in 1992. The percentage of graduates who have found part time jobs decreased from 18% in 1991 to 13% in 1992.

Dr. James F. O'Leary **Philosophy & Religious Studies**

The River Why by David James Duncan (Bantam Press, New York, NY) 1985

The River Why, is a philosophical novel by David James Duncan. Thoreau had his woods; Duncan had his river. What his river meant to him and the lessons he learned provokes our laughter and teases our tears and fears. His commonplace hero, Gus, will take you along with him on his extraordinary voyage of self-discovery. As you journey with Gus up and down his fishing trip, you will drag in the strangest thoughts and meet the most remarkable critters. Descartes, who is described by Duncan as "a ghostly-looking but handsome mongrel graced with an unnerving pair of eyes," wills to be human as surely as our immediate goal is divinity. There is high and low purpose to Duncan's writing; he lets us in on his why in as clever and pleasant a manner as I have read in quite some time. One suspects that this book, like all books, is about the author, a lifelong Oregon resident who learned to read and fish in 1957.

Winds of Fate Winds of Change by Mercedes Lackey (DAW Books, New York, NY) 1991

These two novels mark a return for Mercedes Lackey to her epic series about the fantastic land of Valderman, a kingdom whose protectors are Heralds, men and women possessing extraordinary mental and psychic powers. Heralds are served by Companions, horse-like beings of exceptional age, ability, and sense of humor who communicate telepathically. In fact, the entire world is populated by many amusing and endearing birds and beasts, all of which contribute directly to the plot.

These books introduce the story of Princess Elspeth, Herald and heir to the throne, and Dankwind, Hawkbrother Adept, as they struggle to learn longforgotten magics in order to defend Valderman against the Dark Adept, Mornelithe Falconsbane, a sorcerer of immense power and will. Ms. Lackey is

somewhat unusual among fantasy writers in that her female characters display strength and abilities in equal measure to her male characters. This is a "must read" for lovers of fantasy.

Recycled Papers: The Essential Guide by Claudia G. Thompson (MIT Press, Cambridge, Massachussetts) 1992

In this age of environmental consciousness, this essential book guides designers toward making educated choices about printing papers. Designers have the capacity to shape the choices of their clients in terms of paper choice for printed materials, and this comprehensive guide covers not only recycled papers but also a history of the papermaking process as well as the pros and cons of recycling.

Debt & Deficit by Robert Heilbronwer (W. W. Norton, New York, NY) 1989

Given the size of the national debt and the sharp focus on the debt during the recent presidential campaign, a book on debt by a noted economist should be appealing to the Daemen Alumni. Robert Heilbronwer's book, Debt & Deficit, makes for a good introduction because it is very readable. Heilbronwer explains in basic language the national debt and takes the interesting position that fear of the debt, not the debt itself, is the real problem facing Americans!

Rebuilding Russia Reflections and Tentative Proposals by Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn (Farrar, Straus and Giroux, New York) 1991

A concise, concerned, rather selective one evening "get your feet wet" probe and proposal look at the 'New Russia.' Those less attracted to the author's political analyses might prefer his story telling - try One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovich, The Love-Girl and The Innocent or Stories and Prose Poems.
