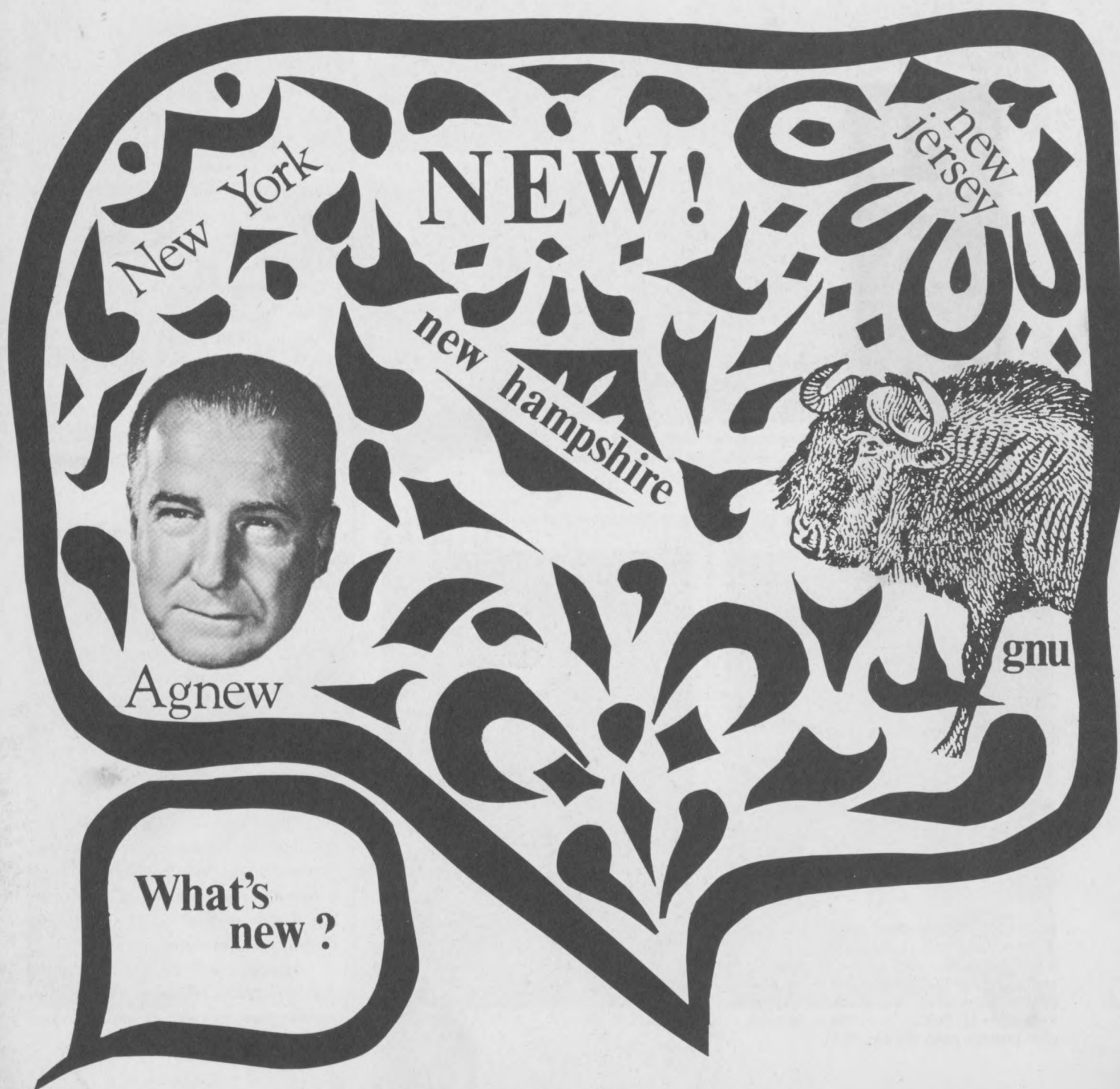

New Alumnae

The membership of the RHC Alumnae Association swelled by 290 at the 19th commencement exercises held May 24. Sister Mary Angela Cavanaugh, OSF, awarded some 100 bachelor of art degrees, 10 bachelor of fine art degrees, 180 bachelor of science degrees and three honorary degrees.

Dr. Leland Miles, president of Alfred University was the commencement speaker. He drew his inspiration for his talk, titled "The Handsome Leg," from a story by Benjamin Franklin of an old man who had one deformed leg and one healthy leg.

Those who would comment on the deformed leg the man would label pessimists and record their names in a black book. But those who remarked about the good leg, the man would term optimists and register in a white book.

Drawing parallels, Dr. Miles said: "The end of educated life ought to be to see both legs simultaneously... to see life whole... to have a balanced perspective."

Patience to probe and investigate, objectivity and a sense of humor are the qualities needed to sustain that philosophy, he added.

Honorary degrees were conferred upon Dr. Miles, Dorris H. Carlson for her contributions to ecumenism and help in establishing the Human Dimensions Institute, and Sister M. Georgia Dunn, OSF, who is dean emeritus and professor of English at Rosary Hill.

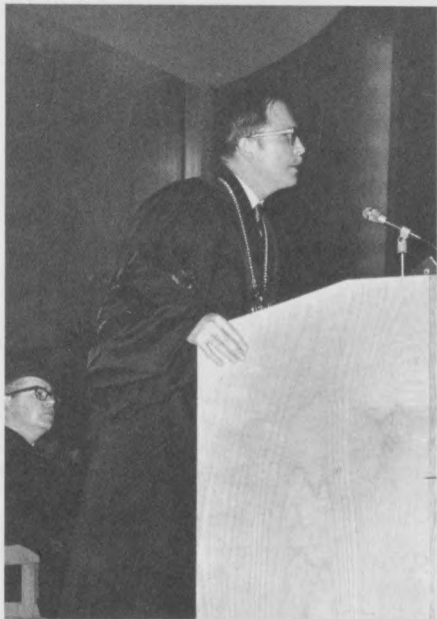

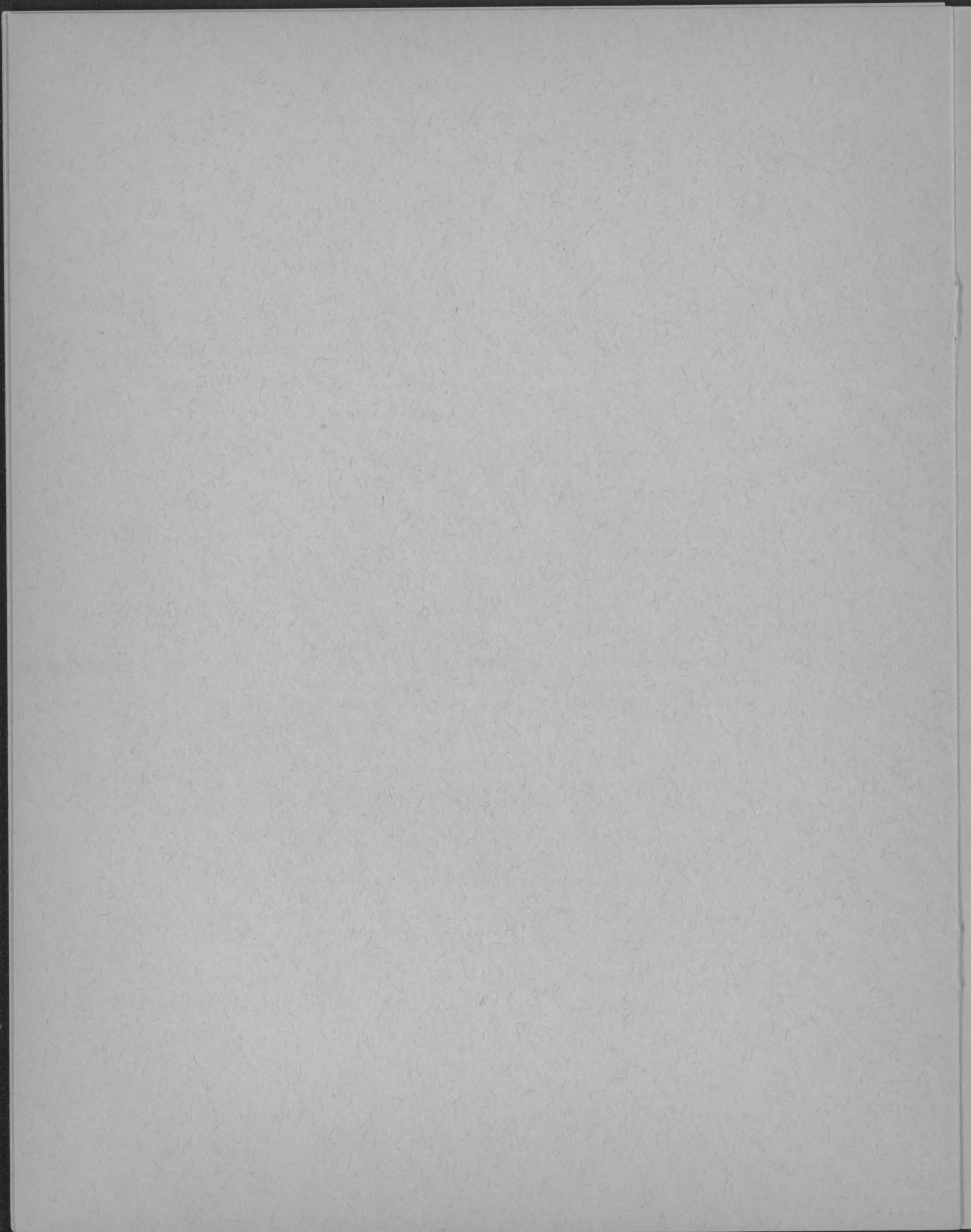
